Well, actually, that was our only reassurance for today. Having disarmed any potential criticism by acknowledging our predicament we say: on to the nervous joking!

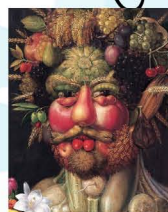

A failed chemistry experiment?

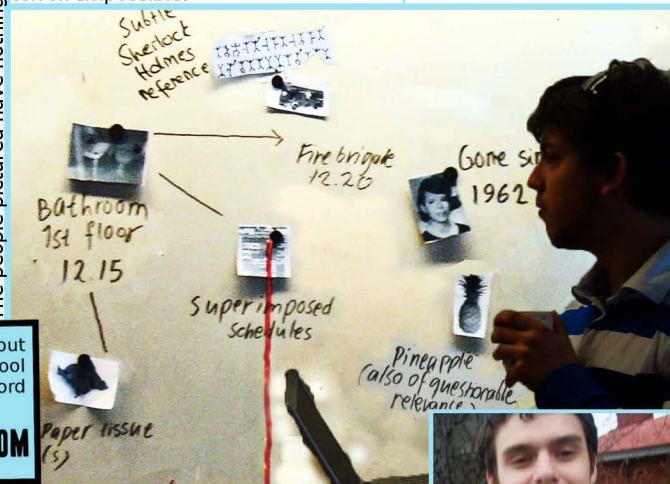
Hmm. That would certainly have excluded everybody but the SP-classes, but I would say it is impossible. Next.

The people pictured have nothing to do with the text



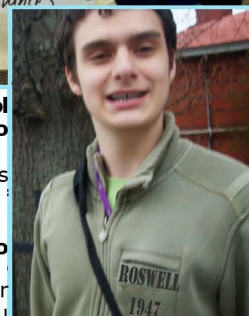
Do you think the school plotted the fire in order to obtain insurance money?

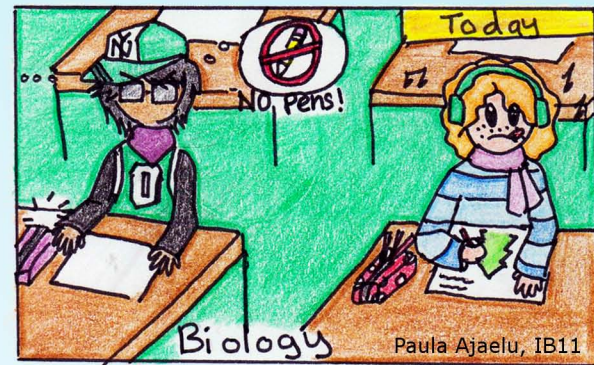
How does it feel to have won the position as chairman?
